The university has established comprehensive anti-ragging measures to ensure a safe and respectful campus environment. Each year, anti-ragging squads are organized to proactively prevent ragging incidents. These squads regularly patrol the campus and monitor key areas such as hostels, canteens, and recreational facilities. They respond promptly to any reported ragging incidents, carrying out thorough investigations and taking immediate actions to halt any harassment. Awareness campaigns are held to inform students about the severe consequences of ragging and the importance of fostering a respectful atmosphere. Victims of ragging receive immediate support and counseling to help them cope with their experiences. The squads meticulously document all incidents and report them to higher authorities for further action. They collaborate closely with faculty, administration, and law enforcement to ensure a thorough approach to preventing and addressing ragging. Strict enforcement of antiragging policies and disciplinary actions against offenders reinforce the university's zerotolerance policy on ragging. Regular anti-ragging programs promote a culture of safety and respect. All students are required to submit affidavits pledging not to engage in ragging, emphasizing the university's serious stance on this issue. Permanent anti-ragging boards are installed in every college and significant office throughout the university to ensure high visibility and ongoing awareness.

The University adheres to its academic regulations to ensure discipline among students. At the hostel level, wardens enforce these regulations to maintain order. In serious cases, the issues are escalated to the chief warden or the concerned Dean of the colleges. These cases are then reviewed by the College Discipline Board. If the matter is particularly serious or involves multiple colleges, it is referred to the University Discipline Committee, which includes the Deans of the Colleges and the Dean of Student Welfare (DSW) as the Member Secretary. The Vice Chancellor, based on the recommendations of the Discipline Committee, approves the necessary disciplinary actions. Various cases have been addressed, including those received from the University Grants Commission (UGC) and other implementing agencies.

2018-19

In the academic year 2018-19, one complaint was received via phone and email, which was promptly resolved. Additionally, 10 incidents of indiscipline were reported. These cases were addressed by the disciplinary committee and were dealt as per the provisions of Academic Regulations Chapter III page 30-32 https://www.svpuat.edu.in/academics-regulations.php. The responsible students were either placed on conduct probation or given warnings to prevent

2019-20

In 2019-20, a single ragging incident was reported through the anti-ragging helpline. This case was promptly handled and resolved by the anti-ragging committee. Apart from above incidents of indiscipline reported for indiscipline were addressed by the disciplinary committee. The cases were dealt as per the provisions of Academic Regulations Chapter III page 30-32 https://www.svpuat.edu.in/academics-regulations.php.

2020-21

During the 2020-21 academic year, one ragging case was reported via the anti-ragging helpline. The anti-ragging committee thoroughly investigated and resolved the issue. Additionally, three other disciplinary issues were brought to the attention of the disciplinary committee, which were resolved after careful examination. Three warnings or conduct probation orders were issued to the responsible students. The cases were dealt as per the provisions of Academic Regulations Chapter III page 30-32 https://www.svpuat.edu.in/academics-regulations.php.

2021-22

In the 2021-22 academic year, several incidents of indiscipline and misconduct were reported to the university's disciplinary committee. After reviewing these cases, the committee issued 18 warnings or conduct probation orders to the responsible students to enforce discipline and protect the affected students. The cases were dealt as per the provisions of Academic Regulations Chapter III page 30-32 https://www.svpuat.edu.in/academics-regulations.php.

2022-23

The 2022-23 academic year saw one written complaint regarding ragging, which was addressed and resolved by the anti-ragging committee. Additionally, due to various acts of misconduct by certain students, 16 warnings or conduct probation orders were issued by the disciplinary committee to maintain discipline and protect the rights of the affected students. One student's mercy plea was also accepted, resulting in a reduction of their disciplinary action. The cases
